President's Letter

n behalf of the Board of our Lake Association, and myself, we hope this year's newsletter finds you well. As we have seen, our nation and our communities have turned upside down in the past two months. Words cannot describe the suffering that the coronavirus pandemic has caused to many of our families and friends.

What started as excitement planning the 2020 SLPOA activities has turned to feelings of uncertainty. The pandemic has created anxiety about our health, the health of our parents and our children, our jobs, and the future. When the Board started discussing this summer's events, the general sentiment was that "it's hard to think about summer" with what we were witnessing.

As the Board waited for signs that the protective actions were "flattening the curve," we had to make tough decisions to postpone summer rituals like the June Picnic, the Ice Cream Social, the Stony Lake Sparkler, and our newest event, the Kayak Poker Paddle. While we all hope that the health trends remain positive throughout the summer, there is enough uncertainty at the present that the Board felt it prudent not to hold our larger events this year. That being said, the Board has decided to go forward with the Boat Parade and Sailboat Races as we believe those events typically involve single families and can be conducted in a safe manner in accordance with Michigan's Safe Start Plan. As for holding our Annual Meeting, the picture is not as clear. In mid-July, the Board should have a better idea regarding which phase the state is likely to be in by early August, and we will make a decision about the Annual Meeting and announce it through our email list and Facebook.

In the midst of this coronavirus outbreak, we're also seeing good all around us. We're seeing neighbors look after neighbors. We're seeing skies clear. We're seeing communities celebrate those on the frontlines who risk their lives to protect and care for others. And we're seeing communities recognize the everyday

heroes like those who drive the trucks, stock the shelves, keep the utilities on, and make it possible for us to shelter at home. If you planned to participate in the Sparkler 5K and you still want to support the Crystal Valley Care Fund, I hope you will consider a donation to the gofundme fundraiser to benefit CVCF started by Amy and Neal Miedema.

Though it is still hard for me to think about summer, I know it is coming right up. And while it might be difficult to think about a summer with facemasks and social distancing, we need to remember the importance of taking the long view and considering health and safety as we move forward.

The Stony Lake Community is strong and we will get through this together.

We hope to see as many of us as possible out on July 4 for the annual Stony Lake Boat Parade. Last year was one of the best ever, and this year the Saturday actually falls on the 4th of July! Let's celebrate that, and our life on the lake, with lots of red, white, and blue, and maybe some pithy themed boats to rival last year's winner about road construction. Looks like we'll have plenty of that to "celebrate" this summer too.

Boats will gather at Green Point at 2:00 p.m. Anyone can join, whether you have decorated your boat or just want to parade around the lake and greet your neighbors. There will be no voting or prizes, and no gathering, but it would be great to see everyone out on the water or out on the waterfront cheering on the parade.

Sailboat Races—a time-honored

Stony Lake tradition-will also go on as usual. If you'd like to participate, contact race coordinator Neal Miedema at



neal_miedema@hotmail.com to be put on the contact list. He lets everyone know when the races are and how they will be structured.

Races are scheduled at 2:00 on Sunday, May 24; Saturday, June 6 & 20. Sunday, July 5, Saturdays July 18, August 1 & 15, and Sunday, September 6. Neal will give a five-minute warning at 1:55, and a two-minute at 1:58. Single sails start at 2:00, Doubles at 2:02, Catamarans at 2:04. Races are cancelled in bad weather (thunder/lightning). If the race is cancelled. Neal will remove the Start/Finish buoy near his dock and hang a "Skull and Crossbones" flag.




