Fishing Tournament Chair Dan Brouwer reported that they had a record turnout last summer and some very impressive fish were reeled in. Special thanks to the parents who got up early and took the kids fishing! Be sure to read the notes below about this year's tournament for a new twist – possible Master Angler eligibility!

**Adult Winners:** (Determined by Weight)

Children Winners (Determined by Length)

First Place Nolan Zavislak 3.4 pound Largemouth Bass Second Place Scott Ferski 3.1 pound Smallmouth Bass Third Place Kassie Baker 1.71 pound Largemouth Bass

## Join the Fun on July 6, 2024!

Adults and Kids 12 and under compete separately. Trophies will be award awarded for first, second and third places in both categories. The tournament runs from 6-11 a.m. Fish caught prior to 6 a.m.will not be considered.

Check in your catch at Dan's dock, fifth cottage down the private lane from the swimming beach. A current Michigan fishing license is required and will be checked. Winning fish for adults will be based on weight, the 12 and under competition fish will be based on length.

All fish in the Adult category must be Legal Game Fish! All participants will only be allowed one rod! (Example: Trolling with 3 rods per person gives an unfair advantage from those casting from boat or docks!)

This year we will look at the fish in the 12 and under category to see if any of the fish caught are eligible for a Michigan DNR Master Angler Award. If they are eligible we will provide the necessary documentation that would be needed to receive a Master Angler award!

# Newz From Around the Lake

The Oceana County Conservation District has two projects in the works that will help to improve and preserve the water quality of our lake.

Construction is expected to begin this spring to remove the remnants of the old Marshville dam, two old bridges, and three culverts, and restore 2,500 feet of instream habitat. Special attention is being paid to the protection and restoration of hemlock-shaded areas along the coldwater trout stream. The project is being coordinated and managed through a collaborative partnership between the Oceana County Parks and Recreation Commission, Oceana County Road Commission, West Michigan Shoreline Regional Development Commission and the Conservation Resource Alliance.

In 2022, descendents of the local Hunter and Hedlund families donated a 40-acre parcel to the District that includes a cedar

swamp and upland habitats along upper Stony Creek. A master plan is in the works for parking, fishing access points, and looped trails that showcase the natural and historical features of the land while retaining the delicate ecosystem. Plant and bird surveys have been conducted, unique natural features have been mapped, and partners have visited to see the unique beauty of the soon-to-be nature preserve. A tentative opening day is planned for summer of 2025.

# Do Your Part with Native Plants

While large conservation projects go a long way toward maintaining good water quality in Stony Lake, neighbors can do their part by planting native species along the waterfront and keeping mowed areas to a minimum. Free magazines were distributed locally last summer



spotlighting ideas for beautiful natural shorelines. They will again be available this summer at local stores, or email Julie Stivers at jlcstivers@gmail.com to get your free copy.

The Oceana Conservation District will host their annual Wildflower Plant Sale on May 24, and the Muskegon Conservation District on May 18. Check their websites for details and a list of available plants.

#### In Memorium

Robert taught lots of kids to water ski, including his niece, Sarah, and nephew, Thomas, who cherished their holidays with their cool Uncle Robert.

**Sally Modrack** passed away in January 2024. She and her husband Bill, who died in 1991, were long-term members of the Stony Lake community. She loved spending summers at their cottage with family and many longtime friends.

### New Interactive Classes for Boater Safety

The Michigan Department of Natural Resources now offers boater safety and hunter education as interactive online courses, giving students an enhanced experience with real-life scenarios.

Boaters born after June 30, 1996, and most personal watercraft operators who operate a vessel in Michigan must have a boating safety certificate.

The interactive learning options are

offered in addition to existing traditional classroom and online learning options for both boater and hunter safety.

Boater safety students who opt for the interactive program will follow a storyline adventure that places them in real-life boating scenarios.

Approved by the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators, the "I Learn to Boat" program allows students

to navigate the curriculum at their own pace and complete the required assessments, including a final exam.

The Michigan DNR recreational safety certificate is valid in other states, which often require an approved boater safety certificate to rent a boat or personal watercraft (such as a JetSki).

Register for a traditional classroom, interactive or online boater safety education course at Michigan.gov/RecreationalSafety.

### STONY LAKE - KEEP HER HEALTHY

"There are some troubled lakes out there," warned Matt Ferguson in his water quality report at the SLPOA Annual Meeting last August. "But not our little Stony. She's a darling little lake, the kind you would take home to meet your mother. With primarily eastbound wind and westbound water, she flows well. She's cool, she's deep and she's beautiful. She's 278 acres, 43 feet deep, half a mile wide by two miles long. As lakes go, she's quite a dish."

Matt, along with John Stivers, venture out on the lake many times each year from April to October (those April ones are a bear!) to collect samples for testing at MSU as part of the Michigan Lake & Streams Cooperative Lakes Monitoring Program.



Thanks to volunteers over the years, we have data collected back to 2004, which enables scientists to evaluate the aging process of our lake and make informed decisions about the best way to treat it. A summary of this data can be found on the SLPOA website, or at the MiCorps website, micorps.net.

In 2010, the Stony Lake Improvement Board was established, and a professional engineering company engaged to collect data and manage annual harvesting of plant overgrowth and control of invasive non-native water plants. Minutes from Lake Board meetings are available by emailing Board Chair Dave Zoller at dzoller@hotmail.com. Contact Dave with questions about treatment and harvesting.

Matt ended his annual report on a lyrical note: "Fed by a large watershed to the north, filtered by the marsh, then springfed in several spots along the way – finally she dances with the big lake. Please do your best to take good care of our little Stony Lake and share good practices with friends and family. She's our friend. She's the lake other lakes would like to be. KEEP HER HEALTHY."
