This increase allows us to cover rising association costs, such as insurance expenses to provide coverage for our water-related activities, event items (like trophies for our boat parade and poker paddle, ice cream and cake for the ice cream social), our website, participation in the Michigan Clean Water Corps Cooperative Lakes Monitoring Program, and the production and distribution of our amazing newsletter. We appreciate your understanding and support as we continue to create meaningful experiences and keep our lake community thriving.

To make dues payment easier and to help us keep more of the dues paid via credit card, we have switched from PayPal to Zeffy. Fishing Tournament kicks off Independence Day Celebration!

The Stony Lake Fishing Tournament has become one of the most popular events sponsored by the Lake Association. We had a great turnout in 2024 with a number of boats on the lake early in the morning. It was a calm but cool day, with a great range of species making a show, especially in the adult division. In addition to the winners below, there were also steelhead trout and brown trout entered as well. Thanks to all!

The 2025 Tournament on Saturday, July 5 will be set up much as usual. Adults and Kids 12 and under compete separately. Trophies will be awarded for first, second and third places in both categories. The tournament runs from 6-11 a.m. Fish caught prior to 6 a.m. will not be considered.

Check in your catch at Dan Brouwer's dock, fifth cottage down the private lane from the swimming beach. A current Michigan fishing license is required and will be checked. Winning fish for adults will be based on weight, the 12 and under competition fish will be based on length.

All fish in the Adult category must be Legal Game Fish! All participants will only be allowed one rod! (Example: Trolling with 3 rods per person gives an unfair advantage from those casting from boat or docks!)

We will check fish in the 12 and under category to see if any caught are eligible for a Michigan DNR Master Angler Award. If they are eligible we will provide the necessary documentation that would be needed to receive a Master Angler award!

Looking forward to seeing all the avid Stony Lake fishers again this summer.

Thanks to volunteers chaired by Matt Ferguson, stepping in for Jeff Larmore, and Sharon Zoller, the festivities continue this summer on Saturday, July 5.

Boats gather at Green Point in the middle of the lake at 1:45 for a 2:00 start. All creative ideas are welcome and all boats receive a participation medal. Trophies go to the top three votegetters. Voting will again be via the internet – look for more details including the URL link, QR code etc. around the end of June on the SLPOA website and Facebook

Ice cream and cake will be served at the Camp Ao Wa Kiya waterfront at 4:00 p.m., and trophies awarded. Parking is available at the camp; walk down the stairs to the waterfront. Or anchor your parade entry on the waterfront and wade in! (No docking available.)

There are still some sailors around Stony who remember the old handbuilt Lark boats, on which many youngsters learned to sail at Camp Miniwanca.

Sailing is still a thrill on our perfectly sized lake, with an abundance (sometimes an overabundance) of lake breezes. Volunteer chairs Neal and Amy Miedema are the latest in a long line of committed sailors who organize weekend races that are fun both for participants and spectators.

This year's season begins on July 6 with the only Sunday race of the year (to avoid conflict with the Boat Parade on the 5th!). Races are then planned on Saturdays, July 19, and August 2, 16 & 30.

Racers gather at the west end of the lake near the Miedemas' dock (clearly marked). The first horn sounds at 1:55, second at 1:58. Newz From Around the Lake

Water Works

Two new projects on upper Stony Creek will make their debut this summer, impacting the continuing health of our lake and improving water quality and access to the creek that feeds Stony Lake. The area around Marshville, on Stony Creek about two miles upstream from Stony Lake, has historic and cultural significance to local residents. George Marsh established a sawmill there in 1861 and a grist mill two years later. A village grew around it, but was destroyed by the same storm/flood that took out the mill town around the mouth of the creek at Stony Lake in 1883. In the 1920s local fishermen built another dam in a different location on the creek to create a pond to pursue their sport, but over the years vandalism and lack of maintenance caused irreparable damage to it.

In 2020 a group of local government agencies, organizations and interested individuals came together to determine the future of the site,

focusing on conservation and water quality efforts, expanded public access and the restoration of the Creek's natural flow. Led by the Oceana County Parks & Recreation Board, the project has restored full fish passage to over ten miles of Stony Creek and its tributaries. All species of fish can now access habitats blocked for over a century. Public access to the fishing area is improved and now includes an access point for people with limited mobility. A large sign at the park will emphasize the historical significance of the site. For more information, check the Oceana Parks website.

In the last edition of this newsletter, we highlighted a project by the Oceana Conservation District to establish a 40-acre nature preserve a mile further upstream from Marshville. Donated in 2022 by descendents of the Hunter and Hedlund families, the Stony Creek Nature Preserve is still under construction as we go to press this year. Keep an eye on the District's website, where you can also find a virtual tour of "these magical woods" created this winter.

Keeping Our Lake Healthy

There are several ways we can insure the continuing health and water quality of our little lake. We have participated in the Cooperative Lakes Management Program (CLMP), a state program to collect data on Michigan's lakes, since 2004. This history of information enables scientists to evaluate the aging process of our lake and make informed decisions about the best way to treat it. The Lake Management Board was established in 2010, also to collect data and manage annual harvesting of plant overgrowth and control of invasive non-native water plants.

Don Huey, age 80, brother of Nancy Huey Migas (who died 2022) and part of the Lake's historic Huey pioneering family, died August 9, 2023.
